This half term we will be completing our measurement unit by applying our knowledge to problem solving. We will then extend this knowledge to ratio and proportion issues. Afterwards we will be looking at statistics and data representation in a variety of charts and graphs.

We will also be reviewing all areas of the mathematics curriculum. This main maths curriculum will be supported by cross curricular maths sessions which focus on investigating

measures (Through spell making) and money problems (through budgeting activities)
