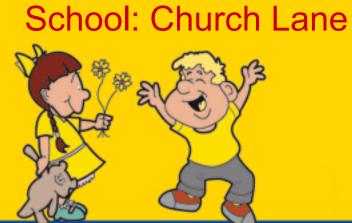

In Maths we will be looking at finding half, one quarter and three quarters of shapes, objects and numbers. We will be able to use inverse operations to help us and will remind ourselves of addition, subtraction, multiplication and division calculations. We will continue to recap place value, number bonds to 10 and 20 and 2's, 5's and 10

In English we will be using our dinosaurs topic to focus on the features of fiction and non-fiction. We will be sorting books, sorting sentences, identifying features and explaining our reasoning. We will be writing information texts and stories to compare the two in our own work. We will continue to work on spelling, punctuation and
