That's it, Year 1 completed! A great topic to end the year, everyone has been really interested in the Great Fire of London and have produced some amazing pieces of writing. We've written eyewitness accounts with fantastic description and have written diary entries as Samuel Pepys, we are much more secure in our knowledge of sentence structure and have produced a huge quantity of work. We can identify the main events of the fire and put them into the correct sequence, we can write in the first person and retell a story from a story map. In Maths we have revisited Place Value, this time for numbers to 100, looked at multiplication and division, position and direction, shape, money and time. A varied way to end the year! Our History lessons have also been linked to the Great Fire of London, we have learnt about the beginning of the fire service and the types of equipment they had back in 1666 compared to modern times. We have also created a timeline of events, studied how London looked in the past and written a fact file about the life of Samuel Pepys, famous diarist whose entries covered the terrible fire.

In our Science lessons we have learned about materials, naming them, identifying them and their properties. We have sorted materials into groups using Venn diagrams, described properties and have tested those properties in an investigation. We then had a challenge to find a suitable materials for an umbrella to keep a teddy dry! We have been learning about different religions in RE again, this time looking into rituals and routines. We have learnt about the Muslim ritual of Salat, the Hindu ritual of Raksha Bandhan, the story of the Good Samaritan in Christianity and looked at a Langar meal from Sikhism. We have also taken part in our RSE discussions about keeping clean and naming the parts of our bodies.

All of the children participated and thoroughly enjoyed a varied and interesting Sports Day as well as a successful Summer Fayre.

Wow! What year we have had! We have ended our academic year 2 learning about the world around us; why it is special and why it is important that we look after it.

#### English:

This term, we have focused on the book: The Tin Forest. The children have produced some beautiful writing on this offering suggestions on how to make use of rubbish and how to maintain this. We have written formal letters, setting descriptions and an explanation text. Not only this, we compared this story to Zahra which is a short film about the importance of water. This is set in a different country and the children found it fascinating that different countries have the same problems but are presented in different ways.



#### Maths:

In Math's, we have been revisiting a variety of mathematical strands to ensure that our skills are fully embedded. We have revisited place value, measures, time and problem solving. We have also been practising using the column method. We are more than ready for year 3!



Topic:

In Art, we have been using natural resources to paint with, to build sculptures and to create collages. We have had great fun doing this and it opened our eyes to how art can be interpreted in different ways.

In History and Geography, we have been on a journey with Christopher Columbus and Neil Armstrong. We enjoyed learning about their discoveries and their discoveries led to inventions. Our history learning took in this direction of learning about Isaac Newton which we found absolutely amazing!



In Science, we have been focusing on plants and their importance to our world. We even predicted what the world would be like without them... it doesn't look good!

Well done to Year 3 for working so hard on the lead up to summer. We have been learning all about Europe this term. The children have used atlases and maps to locate countries, seas and capital cities in Europe. Also they have learnt about Spanish schools. We have also learnt about Lithuania and Latvia and their cultural traditions and learnt lots of simple phrases. This has been a fun term and lots has been learnt!





In English, we have been reading 'The Iron Man' by Ted Hughes novel. This story is amazing! Little did we know the Iron Man wasn't actually so bad! Year 3 have written informal letters in first person as Hogarth who is a little boy from the story who makes friends with the Iron Man to help save Earth from being eaten.

In Maths, we have been working extremely hard with measure and time. We have

been using fluency, reasoning and problem solving to develop our skills in this area. We have really cracked this for Year 4!

Year 3 have all worked tremendously hard this year and I would like to thank them all for an amazing year! Because I enjoyed working with you all so much this year, we are lucky enough to be together again in Year 4! Thank you for a fantastic year this year.

This term, Year Four have been reading Jeremy Brown and the Mummy's Curse! For this unit, we have explored debating and balanced arguments. We have spent a lot of time looking at different sentence structures including complex and compound and how we can use different conjunctions. Each child produced a fantastic piece of writing debating whether Howard Carter was right to enter Tutankhamun's tomb!





In Maths, we have been busy covering two topics of Statistics and Geometry. We explored different ways of representing data

including: bar charts, line graphs, tally charts, tables and pictograms. We were able to read the information, interpret it and even create

our own versions of them too. For Geometry, we have looked in depth at the properties of triangles and quadrilaterals explaining what makes them different

to one another. We also have understood the different types of angles from acute to straight angles. After, we looked at how to plot points and shapes onto a coordinate grid, read them and then even move the shapes different directions.



In Science, we have looked at plants! We have been able to explain how flowering plants are created by examining their life cycles. We could explain the different stages from germination to pollination. Next, we looked at forces. We thought about the different forces that would affect an object's movement and discussed friction and air resistance. We combined this with our

topic of Ancient Egypt to think about how we could move rocks!

In Topic this term, we have been exploring the Ancient Egyptians. We have looked at the importance of the River Nile and even created a pamphlet all about it! We also looked at how the Ancient Egyptians wrote using hieroglyphics and created our own



cartouches to match. Finally, we used our sculpting skills to create our own lucky Eye of Horus!

Well done for all you have achieved this year! Good luck in Year Five!

### <u>English</u>

We have had an awesome term of English. We used our novel of The Boy in the Striped Pyjamas to assist us with our writing. Our theme of World War 2 has run through all of our writing over the past few weeks. We initially wrote a letter as an evacuee – imagining we were taken from our parents. We used strong emotive language to really immerse ourselves in to our letter writing.

We then decided to write another letter about the D-Day landings, this time. We used a video clip to assist us with our learning. We wrote about our travel across the Channel, landing on the beaches and then storming enemy lines.

The children have performed absolutely fantastically during the past 6 weeks, their writing has improved dramatically and they end the term strongly.

### <u>Maths</u>

Measure and Statistics has been the main focus this term. With measure, we have focused on converting. We have had a push on problem solving and using our resilience to ensure we can achieve the best we possibly can. Children have been working in smaller groups to infer information from worded problems to help with knowledge of what skills we need to use.

#### <u>Topic</u>

We have been studying World War 2 during our History lessons; in Geography, we have been focusing on Europe. The children have really enjoyed learning about war; particularly about child evacuees. The children were really able to resonate with the evacuees as we learned about children of the same age.

In Geography, we looked at how war has shaped the continent. We also looked at how rivers were used to travel during war times. Finally, I would like to say a huge well done to year 5! They have been a truly fantastic class and have achieved beyond expectations! Well done and Good luck next year!!!

Following the SATs the Children completed some amazing writing activities based on films and clips we watched as well as loads of Topic work around lighthouses and buoys. I was blown away by their stories and writing.
